PROBLEM GAMBLING SIGNS

If you or someone you know meets at least five of the ten criteria listed below as determined by the American Psychiatric Association as problem gambling behaviors, then professional assistance may be necessary:

- Total preoccupation with gambling
- Plays higher stakes to recoup earlier losses
- Withdrawal symptoms
- Irritability when trying to cut back
- Gambles to escape from problems
- Anxiousness about recovering from previous day's losses
- Lies to family members and others to conceal gambling activities
- Commits illegal acts to finance gaming activities
- Jeopardizes family relationships, career, or education
- Relies on others to provide necessary funds to meet individual or family responsibilities
